Note: Articles often can fit into more than one category. For example, if a man is standing trial for murdering his wife, then this involves law (the law against murder and the trial process), sociology (family relationships), and ethics (murder is wrong). The best category to put this under is ethics because if he had not committed murder, the other categories would not be affected. There is room for differences of opinion on which category is best. Thinking it through is a good exercise in critical thinking and helps you to understand worldview thinking.
